Louise grew up in Piedmont, AL. She was a cheerleader and a graduate of Piedmont High School in 1969. After high school she moved to Marion, AL to attend Judson College, where she obtained her Bachelor of Science in Psychology and Philosophy. She was a proud graduate of Judson in 1972. A lifelong Alabama fan, she couldn't pass up the opportunity to earn her Master's of Social Work degree from the University of Alabama in 1977. Later in her career, she earned her Doctor of Education in Counseling and Social Work from "that other school" Auburn University in 1999. Even though her highest education came from Auburn, she never changed her allegiance from her Crimson Tide.

One of Louise's greatest joys in life was children and babies. She dedicated more than 37 years of her life to the Alabama Baptist Children's Homes where she helped countless children thrive in a broken world.
