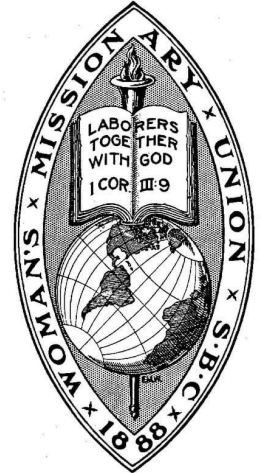


On February 20, 2024, at the age of 87, June Whitlow went to be home with the Lord.

June was born in Augusta, Arkansas on August 18, 1936, to John Paul Whitlow and Mary Agnes Griffin Whitlow. Her parents and two brothers, James Whitlow and Samuel. June received her undergraduate degree in Speech and English at Blue Mountain College in Blue Mountain, Mississippi, and a Master's in Religious Education from Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary in Ft. Worth, Texas.

Before enrolling at Southwestern, June taught high school English in Vandalia, Illinois. Following graduation from Southwestern, she was employed by the Georgia Baptist Woman's Missionary Union of Atlanta, Georgia. After three years, she came to the national Woman's Missionary Union office in Birmingham, Alabama where she eventually retired after 36 years of service. She continued an additional ten years as a volunteer Director of Baptist Nursing Fellowship, a ministry of WMU.

She was an active member of Mountain Brook Baptist Church for over fifty years and the Grace Nelson Hope Sunday School Class. She held many volunteer positions during those years, serving on numerous committees, and was a life deacon.

After retirement, June worked with Better Basics serving several Birmingham schools and volunteered at Rocky Ridge Elementary School in Hoover, Alabama. June also served as Woman's Missionary Union Director for the Birmingham Metro Baptist Association.

June's memorial service will be held in the sanctuary of Mountain Brook Baptist Church on February 26, 2024. Visitation is at 1:00 pm and the service will be at 2:00 pm. She will be buried next to her mother and father in Little Rock, Arkansas.
